Jigsaw (PSHE)

At Littlemoor, we take great pride in ensuring that we create well-rounded, happy and confident children who are ready to learn.

This half-term, our Jigsaw focus will be 'Being me in my world'. Through this topic we will discuss some important issues including similar and different, friendships and feelings.

Mathematical Development



This half term the children will be learning how to:

- Subitise amounts to 3
- Recite numbers past 5
- Count up to 5 objects at one time
- Explore and talk about 2D shapes
- Talk about and create patterns
- Understanding the 'oneness of one'

Counting everyday objects at home and recognising numbers and shapes when you are out and about will be extremely helpful for your child's mathematical development.

Early Literacy, Communication and Language

This half term the children will be learning to:

- Make marks and talk about them.
- Recognise familiar logos and labels within their environment.
- Know that text has a meaning.
- Begin to understand that text is read from left to right and top to bottom in English.
- Name and talk about the different parts of a book, e.g front cover, back cover, spine and pages.
- Sing a range of nursery rhymes and recall the words and actions.
- Talk about the different characters in a story and what they are doing.

Physical development

This half term the children will be learning:

To show independence with eating and drinking.

To take care of toileting needs independently.

To begin to show a preference for a dominant hand.

To climb apparatus safely.

To know about personal hygiene and the importance of being clean and tidy.

To know that washing hands is important after using the toilet and before we eat.

To use feet when climbing apparatus.

Religious Education

The children will be learning how to work as part of a group, taking turns and sharing fairly, understanding that groups of people need agreed values and codes of behaviour, including adults and children, to work together harmoniously. Children listen with enjoyment to stories, songs and poems from different communities and traditions and respond with relevant comments, questions or actions.

We will also be reading Bible stories and taking part in our own daily quiet reflection time.

If you have any questions about how Religious Education is taught to your child, your child's class teacher would be happy to discuss this.

Music

At Littlemoor, we love music and songs are used constantly throughout the day across many subjects. In our music lessons over the next few weeks your child will be learning the following songs:

Expressive Arts and Design

This half term our focus will be:

- To take part in simple pretend play.
