News From Around the Classrooms

Nursery:

Children enjoyed activities based on *Oliver's Vegetables*, measuring carrots to learn about size and exploring a role-play vegetable patch using their imagination.

Reception:

Children listened to *Supertato*, acted out characters in role-play, and completed maths challenges, building confidence with numbers and problem-solving.

KS1:

Using clues, children predicted their new story as *Goldilocks and the Three Bears*. They then retold the story, developing confidence and storytelling skills.

Reading

We are really pleased with the progress that the children are making with their reading and as a team, we are passionate about every child being able to read. All children read daily in school with their reading teacher, and they bring home the book they are reading in school to practice at home. Please ensure that your child is reading at least 3 times each week. Books are changed on a Tuesday and again on a Friday. The idea is that the children keep re-reading the book to develop their fluency. Please try to fill in your child's reading diary when they have read. Every Friday, the children access the 'reading disco' or 'reading cinema' as treat for having their bookbag in school and for having read at home. Thanks for your support with this– it makes such a difference when they are practicing their reading regularly. Some of our older children are no longer reading phonics readers but still need to be changing their books twice a week.
