
Year Two Curriculum Newsletter

Literacy

This half term we will be focusing on non-fiction reading and writing. We will be learning to write a newspaper article and learning to present information linked to our topic learning in a variety of interesting ways. The children will continue to learn phonics. We will be working on our handwriting and presentation skills. Through a range of texts your child will be learning different writing styles and applying their skills to write short narratives, setting descriptions and non-chronological reports.







Mathematics

In Maths, the children will be using their real-life experience to recognise money. Children use their knowledge from place value and addition and subtraction to find the total value of a set of coins. Children should be able to count up in 1ps, 2ps, 5ps and 10ps, and use related facts to count up in 20ps, as well as finding the total of a mixed set of coins. Children also have the opportunity to count up in £1s, £2s, £5s and £10s, and use related facts to count up in £20s, as well as being able to find the total of mixed sets of notes and coins. We also secure the children's understanding on multiplication and division problems, counting in multiples of 2, 5 and 10. We recap odd and even numbers and develop understanding on doubling and halving.

Religious Education

This half-term, following on from our topic of Christians last half-term we will be looking at Judaism with the focus on the special relationship Jews have with God. We will understand how some important Jewish beliefs began. We will learn about the Ten Commandments and explain the rules that Jews believe God wants us to live by.

Computing

This half-term we develop children's understanding of instructions in sequences and the use of logical reasoning to predict outcomes. Children will use given commands in different orders to investigate how the order affects the outcome. They will also learn about design in programming. They will develop artwork and test it for use in a program. They will design algorithms and then test those algorithms as programs and debug them.

<u>Geography</u>

Why is London our capital city?

We will discover information about our capital city and learn about physical and human features. We will recap our mapping skills and know the names of all the four countries, capital cities and the three seas that surrounds the UK. We will be able to identify where London is on a UK map. We will find out about famous landmarks and buildings in London and be able to name these. Children will enjoy finding out about the London Underground and the other transport systems that London relies on to be a successful city.



History

Who were the Victorians?

This half term we will be learning about the Victorian Era. We will start the unit with a timeline identifying key elements of the Victorian period. We will read and research facts about Queen Victoria and complete fact files. Children will begin to understand what life might have been like for them if they lived in the Victorian times. Children will be involved in a 'Day in the life of a Victorian Child' where they will take part in a range of activities, investigate artefacts and try on some costumes. We will also create artwork in the manner of LS Lowry.
