Literacy

This half-term we will be supporting your child's developing phonics knowledge to build their confidence as both a reader and writer. It is so important that children enjoy both reading and writing and we have carefully selected our key texts for this half-term to reflect this. Through these texts your child will be learning how to write character descriptions, diary entries, setting descriptions and non-chronological reports.



Music

Songs are used constantly throughout the day across many subjects. In our music lessons over the next few weeks your child will be learning a new song 'Ho Ho Ho' and will play a variety of instruments.

Of course, at this time of year we're also very busy learning lots of songs for our Key Stage One Nativity which we can't wait for you to see!

Religious Education

In the countdown to Christmas, your child will be learning about why Christmas is an important time of year for Christians. They will also study a place of worship, explore Christian artefacts and symbols.

Your child will be retelling The Christmas Story, taking part in a Christingle service and discussing the season of advent.

Mathematics

Our new topic upon returning to school this half-term is addition and subtraction. Over the past seven weeks, your child has been developing their understanding of numbers up to 100 and will now be solving addition and subtraction equations within 100.

The children will develop their ability to add and subtract using a number-line.

You could be solving simple addition and subtraction equations to support your child at home. If you would like any recommendations on how to practice this with your child at home, please speak to your child's class teacher.

Jigsaw (PSHE)

This half-term, our Jigsaw focus will be **Celebrating Differences**. Through this topic we will discuss some important issues including bullying and how this should be addressed. We will also highlight how we are both similar and different to our friends and why this is important.

History

This half term we will be learning about Bonfire Night and Remembrance Day.

We will also be creating a timeline to set out the history of space. We will be looking at significant events that took place such as the Moon Landing and placing it on the timeline along with our birthdays and parents' birthdays to give an idea of time. We will be learning about heroes such as Neil Armstrong and Buzz Aldrin and what it takes to be an astronaut.

Science
